### **Member News**

You are aware that Jane Zelazny-Belz and her husband Ken had a major unexpected turn to their Thanksgiving plans. Here is a note from Jane..

"First, thank you for all the prayers – whether you knew what was going on or not.

We were supposed to be on a 10 day vacation of sun, fun, and relaxation in Cabo 11/15-11/25.

God had other plans.

The Cliff's version:

Early Friday morning 11/17 – day 2 of vacation in Cabo – I became seriously ill. We saw the hotel resort doctor and he sent us to a wonderful private hospital in Cabo San Lucas –

Hospiten – whose medical director is a gastroenterologist – a perfect thing it turned out for me and my husband. But this was by far one of the scariest situations we've ever been in .

I've never seen my husband cry as much as he has during this entire ordeal.

I was admitted on Friday and underwent tests – I had a blockage in my small intestine.

They tried treating it with meds for the next 48 hours – but on Sunday morning, nothing was working.

It was too dangerous to fly home (and to be honest, I was nervous as hell to get on a plane).

Sunday night I had surgery – which ended up lasting over 4 hours - with 2 blood transfusions.

No cancer (phew) - blockage most likely caused by adhesions from my hysterectomy back in 2009.

But each day after, I felt a little bit better and my vitals were all good - I was able to have liquids on Wednesday and then started with soft foods on Thursday.

By the grace of God, I was discharged on Friday – after 7 days in the hospital.

Saturday, Ken and I flew home on a SW direct flight – under 3 hours is much better than any layover.

Once home, I felt extremely relieved – and was actually able to sleep in a bit longer stretches.

I had a doctor's appointment Monday 11/27 – where I was able to get an appointment with a surgeon.

On Tuesday 11/28 I met with a local surgeon - who was wonderful and understanding, and agreed with everything the doctors in Mexico did.

I still have a LOT of staples in my 10" incision (straight down from my sternum) – this surgeon said I have about 50 (they made them very close together in Mexico) - he removed half and will remove the remaining half next Tuesday.

Each day I'm a little bit better - which is welcome news.

And if anyone ever doubts the power of squats and core exercises, I am living proof that it all works - and will pay off at some point in your life.

"Believe in the power of prayer - it is real, it is wonderful, it is tremendous."
