

Task Force to review, update, and finalize club bylaws and recommended procedures templates to facilitate consistency and common philosophies while acknowledging cultural or legal differences.

Establish region taskforce/work group to work with clubs to get them where they need to be.

Blueprint to facilitate club governing document reviews/changes including potential suggested standing rules

Establish/propose policies and procedures for ongoing review and required updates of bylaws and procedures for both regions and clubs.
